This week, we met the 10% COVID case threshold in some of our classes. In order to limit infection, we have followed the Public Health procedures and advice and have implemented additional measures in order to limit transmission.

Once again, I would like to thank you for your fantastic support with this response. Families have been extra vigilant by doing daily lateral flow tests which has led to a significant number of asymptomatic cases being identified and isolated. The staff continue to wear face coverings in communal areas in school and additional cleaning continues to take place throughout the day. Despite all the recent challenges, we are hoping that we will soon be over the peak and can quickly settle back to normality in school.

We appreciate that children who are absent might be too unwell to access learning remotely, however if they are well enough to complete some school work at home this will help them enormously in keeping up with the journey of learning. Teachers are working hard to avoid gaps in pupils' knowledge and skills and we need your support also with this ongoing challenge.
